A Week with Master Artists

Students will learn about master artists, and then create a work of art in the manner of each artist. Students will discover art history, while creating imaginative works of art. Students will produce a different work of art each day in the method of master artists.

Drawing

Students will gain knowledge of drawing, using light and shadow, line, tone, positive/negative space, crosshatching, and other traditional techniques. Students will learn how to express themselves skillfully in the most readily available art form—drawing.

Color

Students will enjoy studying color theory in different projects each day and creating colorful, harmonious, and contemplative works of art.

Abstract Painting

Students will create exciting and educational, unique, abstract art, using the elements and principles of design and color theory.

Staff & Community Offerings

With her experience as a university professor, Joy Kloman is capable of teaching art workshops to teachers. She can teach drawing, color theory, painting, two-dimensional design, and elements and principles of design. She can also offer preparations, lesson plans, and follow-up activities.

Facilities & Supplies

A computer or slide projector to display images, sink, electrical outlet, photocopier, chalk or dry-erase board, and extension cord are useful. Volunteers are very helpful. If an art classroom is not available, a cart to move between classrooms is needed.

Classroom supplies can help defray material costs, which are approximately \$1-2 per student (supplies depend upon project).

About the Artist...

Joy Kloman was a tenured, associate professor of art at the University of Mississippi, before moving to Hood River, Oregon. She earned her M.F.A. from the University of Florida and her B.F.A. from the Kansas City Art Institute, with specialties in painting, drawing, and printmaking. She has experience teaching students of all ages, from kindergarten to graduate school and seniors. She has traveled extensively, including teaching in London, England and attending an artist residency in Hungary. Her paintings are in the public collections of the Ringling Museum of Art and Gulf Coast Museum of Art, both in Florida, amongst other public and private collections.
